Description

A tall rosewood and lupe d'amboine cabinet with adjustable shelves and marble top designed by Pierre Paul Montagnac

Made in France Circa: 1930

Pierre Paul Montagnac (1883 -1961)

Was born in Paris. He obtained his painting and decorative skills in the Paris at the Academy de la Grande Chaumiere; made his debut at the Salon in 1912. He designed a wide range of commercial and private interiors for an elite. Pairing with a select group of artist and designers including Ivan Da Silva, Raymond Subes, Daum Nancy and Jean Dupas among many others.

Montagnac pieces were marketed through Le Confortable and Galeries Lafayette. At the 1925 Exposition Internationale exhibited at the Grand Salon of the Ambassade Française pavilion and by the 1930's was commissioned works in two the most important Ocean liner, a deluxe bedroom and drawing room for L'Atlantic and the "Caen" suite on the Normandie; he was also appointed president of the of the Societe des Artistes Decorateurs in 1930.
